# Revisiting OJJDP's Human Trafficking Performance Measures



In response to the Government Accountability Office's (GAO's) request for improved data on government-funded services for American Indian and Alaska Native (AI/AN) youth human trafficking victims, OJJDP identified three grant programs most likely to serve this population.


## **Selected Grant Programs:**

1. Reducing Reliance on Confinement and Improving Community-Based Responses for Girls At-Risk of Entering the Juvenile Justice System
2. Defending Childhood AI/AN Policy Initiative: Supporting Trauma-Informed Juvenile Justice Systems for Tribes
3. Mentoring for Child Victims of Commercial Sexual Exploitation and Domestic Sex Trafficking



## Performance Measures (Updated)

- 1-2) Total number of ~~American Indian/Alaskan Native~~ human trafficking victims (existing and new) served through the grant award during the reporting period by type of trafficking (short and long term)
- 3-4) Total number of ~~AI/AN~~ human trafficking victims served through the grant award who experience re-victimization during the reporting period by type of trafficking (short and long term)
- 5) Total number of services provided to ~~AI/AN~~ trafficking victims during the reporting period by the type of service
- 6) Total number of training events held on human trafficking/number of participants *TTA grantees only*



**Data collection began on October 9, 2017.**



# Defining Human Trafficking



# Sex Trafficking

- The recruitment, harboring, transportation, provision, obtaining, patronizing, or soliciting of a person for the purposes of a commercial sex act, in which the commercial sex act is induced by force, fraud, or coercion, or in which the person induced to perform such an act has not attained 18 years of age.

*(The Victims of Trafficking and Violence Protection Act of 2000)*

- For purposes of service provision and data reporting, any sex act conducted by a youth in exchange for a benefit (money, drugs, shelter, clothes, etc.) will be considered as sex trafficking, even if there isn't a third party involved.



# Labor Trafficking

- The recruitment, harboring, transportation, provision, or obtaining of a person for labor or services, using force, fraud, or coercion for subjection to involuntary servitude, peonage, debt bondage, or slavery.
- Can be difficult to detect and may involve activities that are themselves crimes (drug sales, gang activity, credit card scams, etc.), leading to prosecution instead of intervention.

- In the Discretionary 2.0 Questionnaire, grantees select their program category by entering the funds spent on those activities.
- Funds must equal the total project amount.
- Human Trafficking measures are under Direct Service Prevention, Direct Service Intervention, and System Improvement.

# Youth Victimization

Timeframe	Definition	Performance Measure
<b>Short Term Victimization</b>	Number of youth, identified by staff or self as a victim, by type of victimization.	Of youth tracked, number of <b>all/new program youth</b> identified as a <b>sex/labor/both sex and labor trafficking victim</b> during the reporting period.
<b>Long Term Victimization</b>	The number of youth who exited the program 6–12 months ago, tracked or monitored by the program during the reporting period, and identified by staff or self as a new victim, by type of victimization.	Of youth tracked, number of <b>program youth who exited the program 6–12 months ago</b> identified as a <b>sex/labor/both sex and labor trafficking victim</b> during the reporting period.



# Youth Revictimization

Timeframe	Definition	Performance Measure
<b>Short Term Victimization</b>	The number of youth identified by staff or self as a youth experiencing revictimization, by type of victimization, during the reporting period.	Of youth tracked, number of <b>youth</b> who experienced revictimization of <b>sex/labor/both sex and labor trafficking</b> during the reporting period.
<b>Long Term Victimization</b>	The number of youth who exited the program 6–12 months ago, tracked or monitored by the program during the reporting period, and identified by staff or self as a youth experiencing revictimization, by type of victimization.	Of tracked youth, the number of <b>program youth</b> who exited the program <b>6–12 months ago</b> who experienced revictimization of <b>sex/labor/both sex and labor trafficking</b> during the reporting period.



# Services Provided to Trafficking Victims

*The number of youth trafficking victims who receive each type of service at least once during the reporting period.*

- **Number of youth trafficking victims who received:**

- Mentoring
- Behavioral health services
- Mental health care
- Case management
- Basic needs assistance
- Coaching
- Life skills training
- Primary health care
- Housing assistance
- Other services



# Training and Technical Assistance

- Number of Training Events Held by Topic During the Reporting Period.
  - Number of training events held on human trafficking during the reporting period.
- Number of people who attend training on human trafficking during the reporting period.
  - Total number of people, program staff, and community members.



# Discretionary Grid 2.0: Systems Improvement Category

1. Systems improvement measures **(37–56)**
2. Training and Technical Assistance (TTA) measures **(57–68)**
3. Core performance measures **(69–79)**
4. Core requirement measures **(80–97)**
  - ❖ **Nonparticipating State Program grantees only**



# Systems Improvement Measures

- Output and outcome measures.
- Measure impact of systems improvement and change in policies and practice.

## Examples

- Percent change in youth involvement in system at key decision points (arrest, diversion, detention, etc.).
- Community-based services established and by type.
- Partnerships established.
- Policy and practices changed, amended, or rescinded.



# Core Performance Measures

- Outcomes measures.
- These measures are reported across OJJDP grantees.
- Direct service oriented measures.

## Examples

- Number and percent of programs/initiatives employing evidence-based practices.
- Number and percent of program youth who offend and reoffend (short and long term).
- Number and percent of program youth who are victimized and revictimized (short and long term).
- Number of services provided to trafficking victims during the reporting period by type of service.



# Data Reporting Tips



# Data Collection and Reporting Tips

- Review measures ahead of reporting period to plan for data collection.
- Track data on the Data Collection form or other data collection system.
- Track or collect data throughout the reporting period.
- Promote consistency in data collection.
- Enter zero if a measure is not applicable to your program, you do not collect the data, or you do not have the requested data.

# OJJDP PMT Reporting Schedule

- Human Trafficking grantees report data biannually:
  - January–June activity is reported in July.
  - July–December activity is reported in January.
