



Fiscal Year 2020 Internet Crimes Against Children Task Forces: Forensics Capacity Hiring Program for Wounded Veterans Performance Measures

The following pages outline performance measures for the **Fiscal Year 2020 Internet Crimes Against Children Task Forces: Forensics Capacity Hiring Program for Wounded Veterans** and list the data that grantees must report on to complete a Performance Data Report. The Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (OJJDP) requires grantees to provide data for the performance measure in the column labeled “Data Grantee Reports.” Grantees enter their data in the Internet Crimes Against Children Task Forces online system.

Grantees enter data in January and July of each calendar year and are responsible for creating their Performance Data Report. Grantees submit this report to OJJDP through the Grants Management System (GMS).
