
Introduction to Performance Measurement and Performance Measures



Performance Measurement

What is Performance Measurement?

- The systematic and ongoing collection of data about program outputs and outcomes to measure a program's progress towards its stated goals.
- The ongoing monitoring and reporting of program progress and accomplishments, using pre-selected performance measures.





Performance Measures

What are Performance Measures?

Performance measures are indicators, statistics, or metrics used to assess program performance.



	Description	Example
Input	Program Resources	 Grant funding Human resources Employee time
Output	A countable product or service your program provides or produces. The volume of work your program accomplishes.	 Number of youth served Number of trainings conducted Number of technical assistance requests completed
Outcome	A change in knowledge, attitude, skill, and/or behavior that occurs within an individual, family, agency, system, or community.	 Family relationships Job skills Community involvement School attendance Gang resistance/involvement



Performance Measures

- Outcomes can be short term or long term:
 - Short term: The benefits and/or effects program participants experience while enrolled in the program or within 0–6 months post completion/program exit.
 - Long term: The benefits and/or effects participants experience that occur within 6–12 months following program completion/exit.






OJJDP Performance Measurement Tool (PMT)



OJJDP Performance Measurement Tool (PMT)

- The OJJDP PMT collects performance data from grantees and subgrantees and produces reports to be uploaded into the Grants Management System (GMS).
- Prior to each reporting deadline, OJJDP will provide a training webinar on how to access and use the PMT.

Step 1: Log in


 Provide your User Name and Password to enter the Performance Measurement Platform (PMP).





Step 2: Grant Program Selection


- To access the SCA Reentry Reporting module, select the current reporting period and click Go.
- Grantees can also review data from previous reporting periods under the Closed/Read-only Reporting Period tab.





Step 3: Begin Reporting

- Click the RED button under Data Entry Status on the Grantee Status Summary page to begin data entry for your grantee or subgrantee report.
- Any subgrantees created for the federal award will also be displayed on the Grantee Status Summary page under the Subgrantee Performance subsection.

OJJDP PMT Reporting Schedule

- SCA Reentry grantees report data biannually:
 - January–June activity is reported in July.
 - July–December activity is reported in January.





SCA Reentry Planning Measures

- 1. Were planning activities conducted for this award during the reporting period?
- 2. Have you developed a juvenile reentry strategic plan that describes your jurisdiction's long term reentry strategy?
- 3. Is there a juvenile reentry task force or planning committee in place to help guide program implementation?
- 4. Identify the partnerships you developed with state and local government agencies during the reporting period.
- 5. Have you identified the data you will collect as part of your SCA Juvenile Reentry project?
- 6. Have you identified outcomes for your SCA Juvenile Reentry project?



Measure 4: Identify Partnerships

- a. Health
- b. Mental health
- c. Housing
- d. Homeless services
- e. Child welfare
- f. Education
- g. Substance abuse
- h. Victims services
- i. Child support

- j. Employment services
- k. Local law enforcement agencies
- I. Legal services
- m. Mentoring services



Partnerships are defined as those organizations with whom the grantee established a direct or indirect financial or other relationship (e.g., consultant organization, contract, MOU, or media coverage), as a result of the grant funding.

OJDP OJJDP Core Measures

OJJDP has a set of Core Measures that are mandatory for most grantees*

- 1. Number of program youth served.
- 2. Number and percent of programs/initiatives employing evidence-based programs or practices.
- 3. Number and percent of youth with whom an evidence-based program or practice was used.
- 4. Number and percent of youth who offend during the reporting period (short and long term).
- 5. Number and percent of youth who are victimized / revictimized (short and long term).



Additional mandatory and/or optional measures may be identified for certain programs. These measures are important to OJJDP, as they provide valuable information regarding the people the grant funds are serving, the services being provided, and the effectiveness of the services being provided.

^{*}These core measures may not apply to Training and Technical Assistance (TTA) or system improvement grantees, in which case they will report zeroes for each measure.



Measure 4: Number of Services Provided to Youth (Number of Youth Receiving Services)

- a. Number of youth assessed as needing substance use counseling/services during the reporting period.
- b. Youth enrolled in substance use counseling/services.
- c. Youth assessed as needing mental health services.
- d. Youth enrolled in mental health services.
- e. Youth assessed as needing housing services.
- f. Youth who successfully found housing.
- g. Youth who received civil legal services.
- h. Youth successfully matched with a mentor.



Measure 4: Number of Services Provided to Youth (Number of Youth Receiving Services)

- g. Number of youth who received civil legal services during the reporting period.
 - Report the number of youth served not the number of cases.
 - An individual youth may receive assistance on multiple legal issues but should still be counted only once.
- h. Number of youth successfully matched with a mentor during the reporting period.
 - Count all youth matched with a mentor, even if the grant program does not provide or fund those services directly but refers youth to a partner for mentoring services.



SCA Reentry Program-Specific Measures

- 5) Number of drug/alcohol tests performed (Mandatory for Co-Occurring only).
- **6–7)** Number and percent of program **youth who were adjudicated** during the reporting period (short and long term).
- **8–9)** Number and percent of program **youth who had technical violations** during the reporting period (short and long term).
- 10) Number and percent of youth completing program requirements (short term).



Measure 11: Targeted Behavior Change

- a) Antisocial behavior(short & long term)
- b) Family relationships
- c) Social competence
- d) Gang resistance/involvement
- e) Substance use

- f) School attendance
- g) GED
- h) GPA
- i) Perception of social support
- j) Prosocial behavior
- k) Community involvement
- I) Occupational skill training



SCA Reentry grantees must select one of the following, depending on the primary focus of the program.




