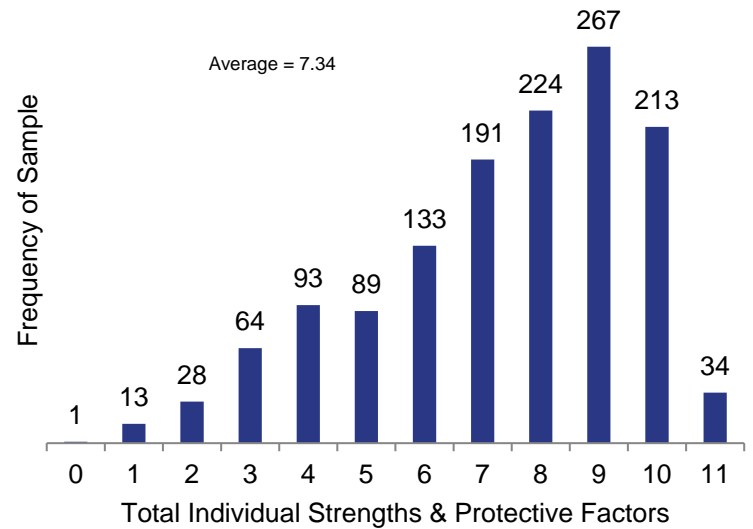
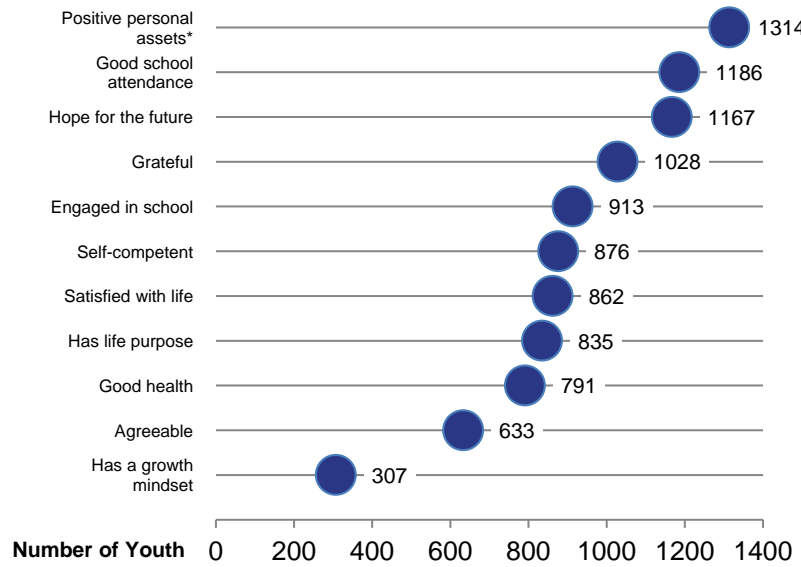


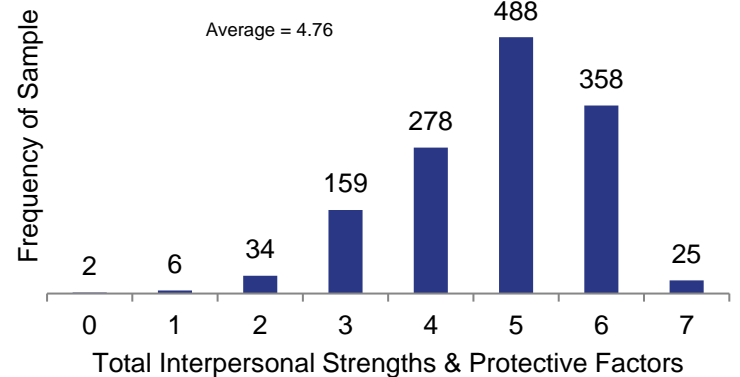
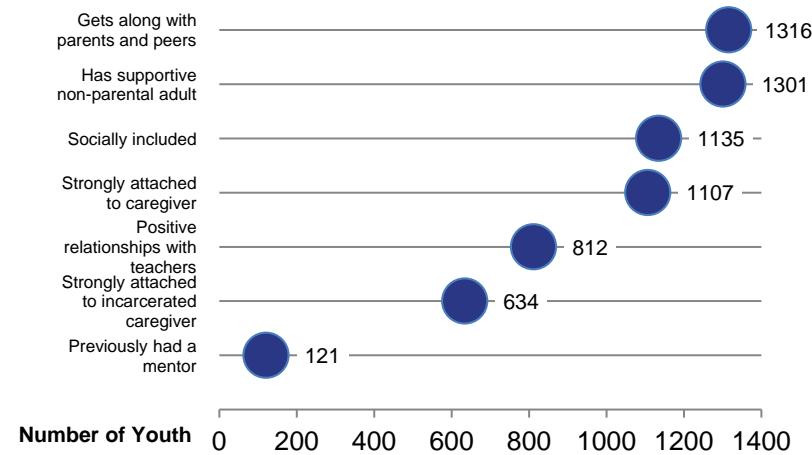

Mentee Protective Factors: Protective factors were categorized as being individual, interpersonal, or environmental protective factors. (N=1350)

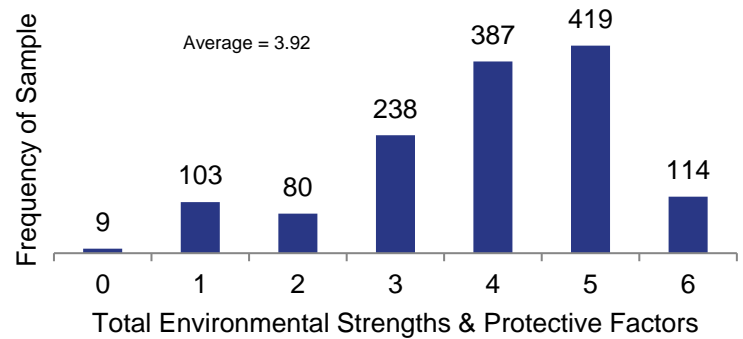
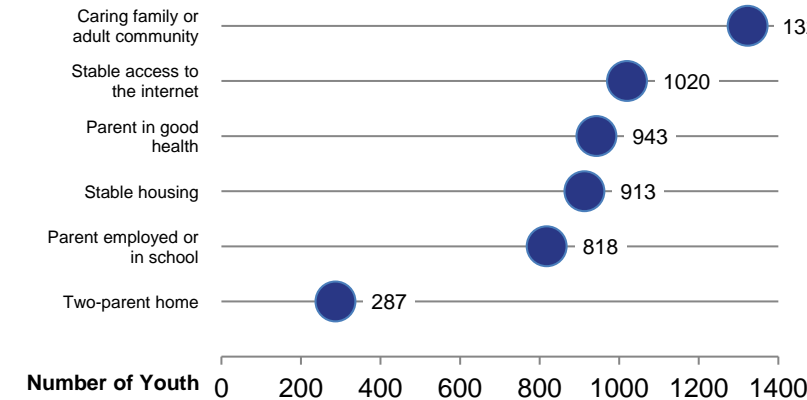
Individual Strengths & Protective Factors
