# OJJDP FY 2010 National Incidence Studies of Missing, Abducted, Runaway, and Thrownaway Children 3 Frequently Asked Questions

# 1. How much money is available?

A total of \$1,000,000 is available under this solicitation. However, based on the availability of funds and determination of successful performance, OJJDP may provide continuation funding of up to \$1 million a year for as many as two additional years.

# 2. How many awards will be made?

One award will be made.

## 3. How long will the grant period be?

The award period under this solicitation is for 12 months. However, based on the availability of funds and determination of successful performance, OJJDP may provide continuation funding of up to \$1 million a year for as many as two additional years.

#### 4. Will proposals submitted under this solicitation be peer reviewed?

Yes, applications that meet the minimum standards described in the solicitation will be peer reviewed.

#### 5. When is the registration deadline for this solicitation?

The deadline to register is 3:00 p.m. eastern time on April 28, 2010.

# 6. When is the application deadline for this solicitation?

Applications are due at 3:00 p.m. eastern time on April 28, 2010.

#### 7. What start date should be used for the project?

Applicants should use a start date of October 1, 2010 or later.

# 8. What areas of research will be considered for funding under this solicitation

The purpose of NISMART 3 is to support multiple research methods that together will comprehensively measure the scope and nature of the nation's missing children problem and estimate the number of missing children recovered each year. This national study should include not only measuring the number of stereotypical kidnappings by strangers, but also the prevalence of familial abductions; lost, injured, or otherwise missing children; runaway; and thrownaway children. This will be accomplished via surveys of

households, juvenile residential facilities, law enforcement agencies, and other entities that may record information on missing child episodes.
